As of the time of this publication we delivered 6 quilts to Kerrville CASA for foster children affected by the July 3rd flood. (See the cute thank-you note signed by the children (recipients)).

6 quilts were delivered to the donation hub located in the United Methodist Church in Hunt, TX. Our final delivery to them this month will include 3 quilts made by CCQG members and 4 members of the BIFFS quilt guild that I have been a member of for 25 years. HILL COUNTRY COUNCIL FOR THE ARTS STOCKING STUFFER PROGRAM

The Hill Country Council for the Arts is partnering with Cibolo Creek Quilters Guild to help make Christmas brighter for the women at the Kendall County Women's Shelter, and the Hill Country Pregnancy Care Center. Many times, Moms, in these situations, give everything to their children and take little for themselves. HCCArts goal this year is to fill and provide 150 stockings to HCPC and KCWS with generous assistance of our community.

We are asking for assistance in sewing stockings. Due by Saturday Nov 22 at 10am-11. Dropoff to Bonnie W. at the library parking lot. She'll take them anytime before then but she asks that you call her first to make arrangements. Stocking directions are as follows:

Christmas Stocking

Notes:

- Stocking outside/ front is the cotton fabric
- Stocking inside/ lining is the fleece fabric
- Seam allowance is 1/4"
- No clipping needed




Step 1

With right sides together, sew one stocking front to one stocking lining at the top of the stocking.
Repeat for second side.

Step 2

Lay out the two sewn stocking pieces with right sides together. The linings and the outside fabrics should match up.
Sew around the perimeter leaving a 4-5" opening in the foot of the lining.



Step 3

Turn the stocking and lining to the right side.
Turn under the 1/4" seam on the opening in the lining foot.
Stitch closed the lining foot.



Step 4

Turn lining to the inside of the outer stocking.
Fold over the cuff.
