Call to Order Carol S

- Meeting was called to order at 10:02

February Board Minutes Approval Carol S

- Motion to approve the February Board Minutes by Sharon R and Second by Lorey W; minutes were approved

President's Update Carol S

- Brought to the attention of the Board that a quilt designated solely for donation was sold at the Oak Hills Women's Conference. Discussion revealed that the quilt was included in the sale group by accident. The policy of the Guild remains that if the maker of the Quilt requests their product be donated (and not sold), that is the path the Guild will take. A maker can designate that their product be either donated or sold at which time the President Pro Temp and the Community Outreach Coordinator will make the determination. If a quilt has been in the Sales Inventory for more than a year, it will be transferred to the donation inventory. The Guild Donation Form has been modified so that the choices are very clear.
- Boy Scout Troop #407 has committed to March, April, and May set up/take-down. They will reevaluate after that.
- All agreed that Deborah from the Texas Quilt Museum gave a fantastic program and the board agreed to invite her back next year for another meeting.
- Liability Insurance for events and Directors has been quoted at \$1550 annually. Carol S in in the process of getting another quote.
- The Center (Kronkosky Place) is going to start enforcing the policy that guests have to pay \$5 per visit. Both of our bees meet there and will decide among themselves what they will do regarding this.
- As members of the Chamber of Commerce, we are entitled to a "ribbon cutting" each year. This year, 2026, is the 10th anniversary of our being a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization. Will coordinate with the Chamber about the ribbon cutting some time this summer.
- Carol S will contact Donna F about getting access to our old Facebook page.
- Boerne Middle School North is requesting help with one of their classes that covers sewing (mostly hand sewing). Carol S has some volunteers and will announce at the March 12 meeting.
- Discussion regarding advertising in newsletter and on Website...Carol S suggested a possible Business Membership for \$100 that would include this advertising. Tabled until next meeting.

- Discussion around whether or not people really read the newsletter. Producing one is labor intensive. Possible that we could produce a newsletter quarterly. Rather than including the sew and tell pictures there, have members sign a release to allow them to be posted on the website.

President Pro-Tem Report

- New Raffle Tickets were purchased and scheduling of the raffle quilt to other guilds has begun. A schedule will be provided shortly.
- Lorey W will provide Karen W a list of all quilts that are currently in the sales inventory so the website can be updated. Pictures, measurements, descriptions and prices need to be provided for new inventory if they are to be added to the website.
- Discussion regarding whether to provide high quality fabric, thread and other items for member quilters for use in products being made for the guild was tabled for future discussion.
