

**CCQG Meeting Minutes**  
**July 10, 2025**  
**Patrick Heath Public Library Community Room.**

The meeting of the Cibolo Creek Quilters Guild was called to order at 7:00 PM by President Jennifer.

**Program:**

- Andrea introduced the representatives from Sleep in Heavenly Peace based in San Antonio.
- Stan Gross described their organization as a volunteer based group who builds & delivers beds to families in need.
- There are 325 chapters in the USA originally started by Luke Mickelson by building beds in his garage and then forming a non-profit.
- San Antonio Chapter was formed in 2017 by Eddie Arnold. They first worked out of a trailer; someone in 2018 let them use a warehouse.
- Their mission stems from the need of every child to have a safe place to sleep as it affects their immune system, anxiety and overall performance in school. 2-3% of children do not have their own individual bed.
- In 2018, 18-21,000 kids in SA don't have beds. 63% are in single parent homes, 6% are in homeless transition, foster families or CPS.
- They operate through word of mouth through churches/schools & application process. Criteria is to live in community, have a house and be 3-17 years old.
- Recipients are provided bed, mattress, sheets, pillow & blanket. It takes 2-4 months for a bed to be made for recipients.
- In 2018, 167 beds were delivered. In 2024, 2,259 were delivered with an average of 25-30 beds per week.
- July is Christmas in July delivery as well as Quilts across America. They partnership with an organization nationally to get mattresses by the thousands.
- Their quilt requirements are simple designs in twin sizes/no tied quilts.
- They logged 4,000s volunteer hours last year with 51 core members; 35 involved in delivery. **Website is shpbeds.org.** Volunteers need to be 12 & up. They are trained and given gear. Lowe's & Home Depot give discounts on lumber. Funding is through grants and donations. Bedding needs to be new/unused.
- Have to cut applications off at 2000 in order to have timely delivery.

- Currently work only in Bexar County. Working with several local high schools and delivering in those areas with one exception in Seguin.
- Andrea presented Stan with 11 twin size quilts.

### **Membership :**

### **President's Update:**

- Jennifer showed pictures of the quilts we sold at the library this month.
- The June meeting minutes were approved with a first from Jennifer G and Second by Karen V.
- Jennifer has contacted the Kerrville Guild president to see how we can support and she has heard nothing yet.
- Sew Special is raising money for Kerrville and individuals are welcome to do whatever they wish.
- Jennifer posted some of her quilts on her personal FB page and received donations.
- Jennifer has been teaching a youth art camp; taught them to sew and embroider.
- Sew Special donated 72+ yards of fabric for charity quilt backs. Please thank them if you visit the shop.
- Budgeted for 70 members & currently are at 67. Quilt sales goal is \$2000 & currently at \$1885. Many sales at library. We are under raffle sales goal and also under in expenses.

### **Sales/Raffle Quilt update:**

- Jennifer recognized members present who had helped to set up or take down the library quilt display.
- Look for quilt each Monday on Guild FB page and please share.
- Sign up to sell raffle tickets at Kerrville & New Braunfels.
- Bonnie needs someone to cut backs for 3-4 quilts. We have fabric but need quilters. 5-6 tops are finished and ready to be quilted.
